Liz has received various prestigious awards for her contributions to netball and sport over the years. In 2000 she received an MBE for her services to netball, in 2005 an OBE for her services to sport and in 2015 a CBE for her services to sport. A year later, in 2016, Liz was awarded the Sports Journalists’ Association award for services to elite sport and in 2019, a Lifetime Achievement award from the British Sports Industry.

CEO and Founder of

Jason has spent much of his professional career assembling evidence to tell stories. Jason had 15 years experience in creatively solving problems with Y&R advertising as their National Ideas Director before setting up DOT with Paul in 2014. One of Jason's strengths is his ability to simplify and link complex data and analytic concepts. This drives meaningful engagement with leaders and decision-makers by growing their understanding of what is possible in their own words. Jason is also a board member for Cricket Wellington, Cricket Museum, EightyOne and a selector for the White Ferns.

On the back of an enviable record, the popular Dame Noeline Taurua was installed as the 11th Silver Ferns coach in 2018 and wasted little time in leaving her mark. In just 11 short months, the well-respected and affable Taurua completely transformed the Silver Ferns fortunes, from finishing out of the medals at the 2018 Commonwealth Games to world champions in 2019. It was the Silver Ferns' first world title in 16 years.

She received the highest recognition when she was named a Dame in the 2020 New Year Honours, just the third netballer to be awarded a Dame Companion of the New Zealand Order of Merit [DNZM].

A mercurial goal attack, Taurua played in the 1995 World Cup and 1998 Commonwealth Games for the Silver Ferns before a knee injury ended her career. She quickly moved into coaching, working her way through the ranks while fashioning a stellar career at elite domestic level in both New Zealand and Australia.
